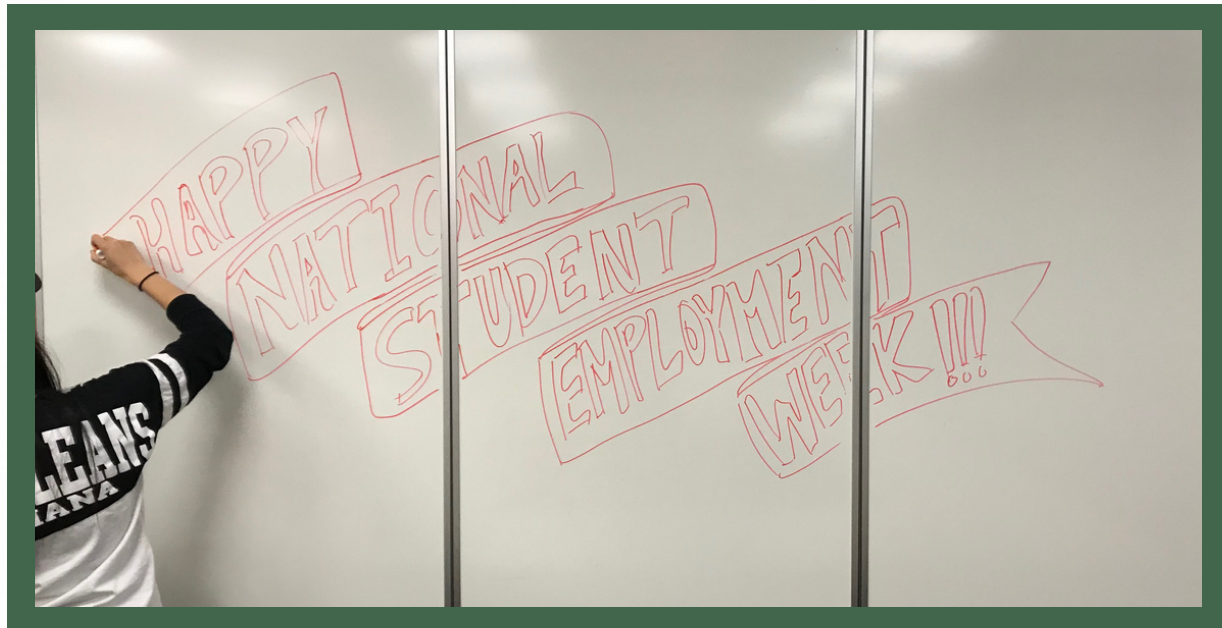

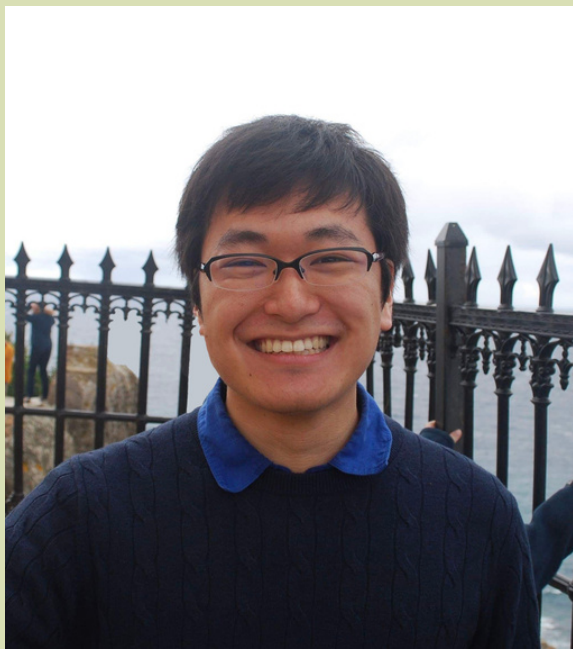

What made you apply for this position?

I had done empirical work during my undergraduate studies, and hoped to use those skills in conducting empirical legal research. Empirical research is not as prevalent in legal academia (and among law students) as I think it could be, and I wanted to aid people in using quantitative methodologies.

How do you balance school and work?

It's been helpful to communicate well with your supervisor and the professors you are working with. The research is also quite different from my schoolwork and provides a good variety, so it's common for me to work back and forth between my school work and my assigned work.

What are your personal keys to success?

I feel it's important to be aware of your supervisor's needs. Sometimes it is critical to be prompt, and to complete the deliverable as quickly as possible; for other assignments the timeline might be longer. Understanding the research rationale and the bigger picture are also important components. Sometimes it's necessary to change directions or to backtrack a bit, which can be frustrating, but I try to accept that it's just part of research.

How does it relate to what you are learned at Harvard?

As a law student, the work provides a complimentary approach to more doctrinal understandings of law. It is cool to be able to work with many law professors and interact with them on a personal level.
